Acts 4:23-31— Acts: Jesus Builds

Big Idea / Outline

There is transforming power when we follow Jesus' model for prayer. The disciples prayed this way in Acts 4. They sought God's face (1. *Reverence* vv24-26, 2. *Response* vv27-28) before they sought his hands (3. *Requests* v29, and 4. *Readiness* v30). A big God leads to big requests.
